

SUBJECT: Declaration of conformity with the RoHS Directive (2011/65/EU and subsequent amendments)

Dear Customer,

Motor Power Company Srl declares to have read and understood Directive 2011/65/EU and Delegated Directive (EU) 2015/863 and subsequent amendments on the Restriction of the use of certain Hazardous Substances in electrical and electronic equipment, also known as "RoHS Directive".

Motor Power Company Srl also declares that it does not directly analyze the materials to find the presence of dangerous substances covered by this provision, but has a regular and formal request to its suppliers so that the conformity of the products purchased is decreed in accordance with the provisions of current regulations.

According to what we know, after receiving a declaration from all the suppliers concerned, our suppliers of electrical and electronic equipment do not use, in their production, the dangerous substances listed in the aforementioned EU Directive beyond the permitted limits.

Therefore, the products supplied by Motor Power Company contain EEE subcomponents (electrical and electronic equipment) compliant with the RoHS Directive 2011/65/EU and subsequent amendments, based on the documentation provided by the respective manufacturers (sub-suppliers of Motor Power Company).

We therefore declare that:

1. All materials, components and products supplied comply with the RoHS Directive 2011/65/EU and subsequent amendments and do not contain the 10 substances subject to restriction (Lead, Mercury, Cadmium, Hexavalent Chromium, PBB, PBDE, DEHP, BBP, DBP, DIBP) beyond the permitted limits, as required by' Annex II of Delegated Directive (EU) 2015/863 amending Annex II of Directive 2011/65/EU.
2. Any exemptions provided for in the Directive are clearly identified and justified.
3. The information reported in the declaration is based on verifiable data, such as material certifications or sub-supplier declarations.
